YMS BAND GOALS

- We will provide a complete music education experience for all students who demonstrate the ability and interest in learning instrumental music.
- We will commit to doing our best in every practice and performance. Doing anything halfway is not worth the effort.
- We will contribute to the school and community through the public performances and service and participation in community events, and work to foster community and parent support.
- We will model and encourage the development of strong character traits like personal responsibility, integrity, hard work, and respect for others.
- We will provide students with a positive group experience where they may grow socially as they learn and help one another succeed in music.

GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

- Arrive at all class meetings, practices and performances with the correct equipment and positive attitude.
- Make a real effort to learn and improve daily - this means **individual** effort and practice to improve the entire group as a whole. Do what you say you are going to do, to the best of your ability.
- Be respectful, honest, and fair with others.
- Remain in the designated area (s) of the band hall at all times. Any student "out of area" will be considered skipping class and will be disciplined according to school policy.
- Respect the belongings of others. **Do not touch or play instruments or equipment that does not belong to you unless given specific permission by the director.** This includes ALL percussion equipment, school owned instruments, computers, and other students' instruments.
- **Gum, food, or drink is not allowed in the band facilities (water only).** This includes other spaces on the band hall.
- Throw away trash any time you see it - help keep the band room tidy!
- Clean cubby at least once a week - help keep your personal spaces tidy!
- During the school day, students may leave instruments and music in cubbies. Personal belongings should not be left in cubbies during other classes or overnight - YMS and Mr. Robinson are not responsible for any personal items left in the cubbies or the band room.
- Instruments are to be taken home at the conclusion of the school day. The band director and the school are not responsible for the safekeeping of student owned or school issued instruments left overnight in the band room. **You also cannot practice if you do not take your instrument home!**
- Only students enrolled in band are allowed in the band room - this includes before or after school.
- Follow all York Middle School expectation and rules at all times.
- Follow all school guidelines regarding social distancing and wearing a mask when appropriate.

CLASSROOM BEHAVIORS

Students are expected to:

- Use the restroom either before or after class (restroom during class should be reserved for emergencies only. Emergencies don't happen every day!)
- Be polite to other students and instructors.
- Enter the band room in a quiet, calm manner and be on time for each class and rehearsal.
- Walk while in the band room and refrain from horseplay.
- Have their instruments assembled when the teacher begins class or rehearsal.
- Follow all daily classroom procedures.
- **Have their all required materials in class each day.**
- Not talk during instructional time. Raise their hand to ask relevant and necessary questions.
- Follow the directions issued by Mr. Robinson, guest instructors, and chaperones.
- Handle your own instrument with care. **Students causing damage to either York Middle School band equipment or another student's instrument will be held financially responsible for the repair or replacement of the damaged item.**

CONSEQUENCES

Students who fail to meet the above expectations will face the following consequences:

1. Verbal warning/redirect

Any consequences after a verbal warning will also result in a 0 for daily participation

2. "Time-Out" in Composer's Corner
3. Pack up for the rest of class, complete alternate assignment in Composer's corner
4. BI Referral and Phone call home or parent conference/possible Administrator intervention.

Certain of the above disciplinary steps may be skipped depending on the severity of the offense. In the most severe cases or in cases of frequent and persisting behavior issues, the student may be removed from the program subject to administrative approval. Please refer to YMS Discipline Policies (student handbook) for more information.

DAILY CLASSROOM MATERIALS

Students should have the following materials for class each day. Refer to the Materials Guide for more information:

Metronome and Tuner

Band Binder (first one provided)

Pencil (first one provided)

All instrument specific materials listed in the **Equipment and Materials guide**.

Habits of a Successful Middle School Musician (available for purchase)

Students will be provided with the following materials:

7th Grade:

Standard of Excellence: Student Edition, Book 1 and Book 2

8th Grade

Standard of Excellence: Student Edition, Book 2 and Book 3

Because these materials are property of York Middle School and are on loan to students, care should be taken to keep materials in good condition for future student use. Students will be responsible for replacing any overly abused or damaged school owned materials.

Causes for replacement may include but is not limited to:

- Missing cover
- Missing pages
- Excessive damage or markings (other than musical reminders) to cover or pages.
- Missing CD-ROM

Students are responsible for having the above materials, in addition to their instrument, for every class meeting. If you are having trouble acquiring any of these materials, please contact the director.

If a student forgets materials, they may be able to borrow from the director - however, supplies are limited. This should be handled BEFORE class begins. **MATERIALS CHECKS WILL OCCUR ON A REGULAR BASIS. The materials I check for vary from day to day, so students should always be prepared.** Students who are found missing materials on a given day will receive a zero for a daily participation grade.

SCHOOL INSTRUMENT AND EQUIPMENT USE AND CARE

Instruments owned by the band program are available for student use. Each student who uses a school-owned instrument is responsible for the care of the instrument. If an instrument is damaged due to negligence, the student will be responsible for the entire cost of the repair or replacement. Malicious damage to any instrument will be addressed under appropriate YCHS and York School District No. 1 policies.

All students using school-owned instruments will be required to **pay an annual rental and maintenance fee of \$100.00**. If the fee is not paid by the fee payment deadline, it will be reported to the appropriate YMS administration. Students will also be responsible for supplying himself/herself with an appropriate mouthpiece/reeds-unless otherwise directed.

CONCERT ATTIRE

YMS Band Polo

- Provided before each performance
- Failure to wash and return on time will result in a \$20 replacement fee

ALL BLACK dress pants

- Slacks/formal pants only
- No jeans/sweatpants/shorts

ALL BLACK SHOES

- No flip flops, tennis shoes, Toms, Sperrys, etc.
- ALL BLACK socks for shoes that require them.

JEWELRY/HEADWARE in BLACK, SILVER, OR GOLD only.

Just as one trumpet player who misses a note affects the sound of the entire band, one person who fails to wear the proper garment reflects poorly on the entire group. As a general rule, if something seems questionable, it probably is. If acquiring any of the required clothes is a problem, please do not hesitate to contact the Director. **Please acquire the proper attire or address any issues sooner rather than later.** A student may be prevented from performing because they are not dressed properly. With all of the hard work your students put into preparing for a performance it would be shame for them to miss an opportunity because they are wearing tennis shoes. Parents, please do all you can to ensure that your student adheres to the dress code!

GRADING

I. Class/Rehearsal Participation

Students receive grades each day based on preparedness and participation in class/rehearsals. Failure to bring all required materials to class will result in a lower daily participation grade. Students who fail to bring their instruments to class will receive a 0 for the day. **You must bring a note from home if your instrument is in the shop.**

II. Assessments, Pass Offs, Rehearsals, and Performances

Students will have playing and written tests throughout the year. These are conducted often to monitor progress of the class and individual. Quizzes/Pass offs may cover scales, concert music, selected exercises, routine, and others. Many of these assignments will occur through remote instruction on Canvas or SmartMusic. Subject to COVID-19 guidance from the district, after school rehearsals may be scheduled at various times throughout the year (with notice well in advance). An unexcused absence from one of these rehearsals will result in a 0 for a major assignment grade. An unexcused absence from any performance will result in a failing grade for the grading period. Students will have the opportunity to make up **excused absences** through alternative assignments (see VII). The guidelines/grading procedures for rehearsals and performances may change this year based on COVID-19 guidance from school administration and the district.

III. Calculation of Grades

Assessments/Rehearsals/
Performances - 70%

Daily/Materials - 30%

IV. Missing Assignments/Low Grades

It is the student's responsibility to ask for makeup assignments or retakes. Students may make up missing assignments or retake any low test grades as many times as desired by the end of the grading period.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Attendance at all scheduled performances and after school rehearsals are **MANDATORY** as they each count for major test grades. Any student who has an unexcused absence for one of the events will receive a 0 for a major test grade, resulting in failing grade for the grading period. Dates will be provided well in advance so please take care not to schedule conflicting doctor's appointments, vacations, etc. **IN GENERAL, I TRY MY BEST NOT TO SCHEDULE REHEARSALS ON WEDNESDAYS OR FRIDAYS.** The guidelines/grading procedures for rehearsals and performances may change this year based on COVID-19 guidance from school administration and the district.

When Absences May Occur

- Any conflicts with rehearsal should be given **in writing** at least **7 days in advance**
- In case of sudden illnesses, a telephone call is a must so that we know the location of your child.
- When absent from a performance or rehearsal, a signed written statement is required for documentation

****Should a student be involved in another school activity which conflicts with rehearsal time, an arrangement between the advisors and the student will be discussed. Coaches/other teachers are usually VERY good about working with us on this, but ONLY if students plan ahead and communicate!****

FUND RAISING

EVERY MEMBER OF THE BAND IS EXPECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN FUND RAISING! The most important function of our fundraisers is to help students earn money for their individual student account and to supplement school district funding with the purchase of needed supplies and services necessary to allow the band to grow and perform at an ever increasing higher level. We provide several different fundraising opportunities, so families can choose the one that works best for them (or participate in all of them to maximize our impact!)

Student accounts can be used to cover the cost of band fees, trips, or supplies. Unused student account money becomes property of the YMS Band once a student leaves the program. Students moving from 8th to 9th grade who join band at YCHS may have their money transferred to their high school account. ***Bad checks collected during fundraisers will be the responsibility of the seller's family.***

PAYMENT

YMS Band will accept cash and checks for the payment of fees and purchase of materials. Checks should be made out to York Middle School Band, and **must be accompanied by a name and phone number**. Checks will not be accepted without an accompanying name and phone number. Cash should be sent with exact change only. **ALL MONEY SHOULD BE BROUGHT TO SCHOOL IN AN ENVELOPE or Ziploc bag WITH THE STUDENTS NAME AND THE REASON FOR PAYMENT. Mr. Robinson WILL NOT accept lose checks/cash.**

HOW PARENTS CAN HELP

AT HOME:

- Show an interest in the music study of your child
- Arrange a regular time for him/her to practice (a quiet place with no interruptions)
- Help the student keep a daily record of his practicing
- Give him/her a safe place in which to keep the instrument
- Keep the instrument in good repair with reeds, etc., in the case
- Help him/her to be early for rehearsals and lessons
- Make faithful attendance at all activities important
- Encourage him/her to play for others when opportunities arise, in the home, at school, church, and in the community
- Double-check behind your student
- Check email, web page, and or Facebook page updates daily

AT SCHOOL:

- Notify the director if he/she is to be absent or tardy for lesson, rehearsals, etc., and explain why in writing
- See that he/she takes the instrument and the music when needed at school and brings it home for individual practice
- See that he/she stays current with classroom studies and makes up work he/she has missed.
- Discuss with the Band Director anything that will help them to understand your child
- **Attend performances and parent meetings whenever possible**
- Help with parent activities, such as fundraisers
- Assure that all Student fees are paid
- Provide private instruction
